

Pre-Conference Highlights



Mr. Mazen Malkawi, Regional Advisor for Environmental Health at WHO EMRO, provided a thorough overview of WHO's activities, emphasizing the safe management of chemicals and the Global Framework on Chemicals. 
Oral Abstracts and Posters

The Gala Dinner at Almayass was a unique blend of international camaraderie, making it a standout event in the conference.


